

Bruce Gerbi, PhD

Bruce Gerbi graduated from the University of Pittsburgh in 1974 with a BS in biology and in 1976 received an MS degree in Medical Physics from the same institution being supported by a Public Health Service Fellowship. He worked at Mallinckrodt Institute of Radiology in St. Louis, MO from 1976-78 and was certified in 1978 by the American Board of Radiology in Therapeutic Radiological Physics. From 1978 to 1981 he worked in San Antonio, TX as a Radiation Therapy Physicist at the Nix Hospital and the Cancer Therapy and Research Center. He was hired at the University of Minnesota, Department of Radiation Therapy in 1982 and earned his PhD in 1987 in Biophysical Sciences and Medical Physics. From 1989 – 2002 he was the Assistant Head of the Physics section and Head of Physics from 2002- 2011. In 2001 he was elected a Fellow of the American Association of Physicists in Medicine and in 2006 was elected as a Fellow of the American College of Medical Physics. In this same year, he was promoted to full Professor at the University of Minnesota. He has served on the AAPM Board-of-Directors from 1996-1999 as the NCC-AAPM representative and from 2007-9 as a Board Member-at-Large. From 2004-6 he was the Vice-chair of the Residency Education Program Review Committee, CAMPEP and Chair of the REPRC, CAMPEP from 2006-12. He is currently the Program Director of both the CAMPEP Accredited Therapy Physics Residency Program and the CAMPEP Accredited Graduate Program in Medical Physics at the University of Minnesota. His medical physics expertise is in radiation dosimetry with current interests in developing wireless radiation detectors for in-vivo, real-time patient dosimetry.
