
## Minsong Cao, PhD



Minsong Cao received his PhD in Medical Physics from Purdue University in 2007 and then joined Indiana University as an Assistant Professor. Dr. Cao helped build a CAMPEP-accredited medical physics residency training program at the Indiana University and served as Associate Program Director.

In 2012, Dr. Cao joined the Radiation Oncology Department at University of California, Los Angeles and is currently an Associate Professor and Associate Vice Chair of Education. After joining UCLA, he helped built the CAMPE-accredited medical physics residency program and served as the Director of the Program since 2014. He also serves as faculty at the CAMPEP-accredited Physics and Biology in Medicine Graduate Program at UCLA. Dr. Cao is actively involved in teaching and mentoring of graduate students, medical physics and radiation oncologist residents. He was a recipient of the 2017 Association of Residents in Radiation Oncology (ARRO) Educator of the Year award as recognition for his educational contributions. Dr. Cao has been involved in global outreach education and training of medical physicists in multiple developing countries including Vietnam, Brazil and China.

Dr Cao's primary research interests include MR guided radiotherapy and advanced treatment planning. He has authored over 70 journal articles and 4 book chapters and been invited to present at various national and international meetings. Dr. Cao has served in many capacities within AAPM. He is a member of multiple AAPM committees and currently the AAPM liaison to the Medical Dosimetry Certification Board. He had served as mentor for the Summer Undergraduate Fellowship Program and President of the Ohio River Valley Chapter of AAPM. He currently serves as Associate Editor for JACMP, Senior Associate Editor for the Red Journal and residency program reviewer for CAMPEP. Dr. Cao is a Fellow of AAPM.
